Cuts, abrasions, wounds, burns, friction	Possible	Minor	LOW	1. Participants may graze skin along matting while jumping. 2. Participants may graze skin down netting while jumping. 3. Participants could injure themselves on debris on the matting. 4. Damaged equipment causes injury	1. Ensure equipment is set-up and maintained to manufacturer's standards. 2. Remove trampoline from service if damaged. 3. Ensure participants wear socks to minimise bare skin contact. 4. Inspect and clean as required. 5. Restrict access until all components are in good working order	LOW
Stuck, crushed, entangled	Possible	Major	Medium	1. Injury when participants collide while jumping. 2. Injury when participants land on each other. 3. Injury from double bouncing.	1. Ensure only 1 participant is on each trampoline at a time. 2. Ensure activity is supervised by a capable adult.	LOW
Slip, Trip, Fall	Possible	Moderate	MEDIUM	1. Bouncing off the trampoline	1. Only use if sides are in good working order. 2. Ensure activity is supervised by a capable adult.	LOW
Exposure to elements	Possible	Minor	LOW	1. Participants may suffer heatstroke or sunstroke in extreme heat, especially children or elderly. 2. Risk of electrocution in storms 3. Risk of hypothermia in cold conditions 4. Risk of slipping in wet conditions.	1. Wear sun protection in hot weather 2. Encourage adequate water consumption. 3. Cease activity in temperatures above 34°C 4. Cease activity when thunder is audible. 5. Participants should wear clothing appropriate to conditions 6. Do not conduct activity if deemed unsafe due to weather conditions	LOW

Likelihood	Definition
Almost certain	Is expected to occur; almost inevitable
Likely	Will occur in most circumstances; not surprising if it happens
Possible	Possible or likely to occur in some circumstance
Unlikely	Could occur in some circumstances; surprised if it happens
Rare	May occur only in rare or exceptional circumstances, but would be highly unexpected
