Instruct and remind the participants to keep a firm grasp on the chest bar to prevent it from moving away and coming crashing back towards their chest.	M

✓	H	Straining when pushing / pulling the Ferris Wheel, whiplash when going around	Ensure those pushing have been inducted in the correct and safe way to push the Ferris Wheel. Encourage regular rotation of pushers to avoid unnecessary repetitive actions.	M

✓	H	Slipping when getting up or down from the mounting platform	Ensure platform is free from debris and cleaned off regularly to avoid getting slippery.	M
